Summer Program Structure

This season is designed to create radical growth and challenge every area of your life. The structure and the rules of this program are established to impact the following areas: spiritual, personal development, and ministry.

1. Spiritual – To build up your relationship with God, your character and your vision.
- .. Daily devotion – daily prayer and devotion meetings

.. Bible Study – Bible study interpretation and application from youth pastors, senior pastors, and speakers from around the nation and beyond

2. Personal Development – To help build you academically, vocationally, and relationally.

.. Sharpen speaking skills: Interns will be required to give their testimony at selected events, and will periodically lead devotions

.. Administrative work: Develop essential work ethics and appropriate office behavior

.. Delegation: Principles in releasing projects and assignments to team members

.. Time Management: Stewardship of the non-renewable resource of time

.. Problem Solving: Lessons in getting the job done well through the application of resources wisely

.. Discipline: Pushing through the barrier of laziness; stick-to-it-ness in the face of adversity

.. Resources: Learn to steward your money and resources
